It is believed that everything in the Order of Creation has its own goodness and purpose. It is also an accepted fact that not everything in the created world order is good for everyone consumption.

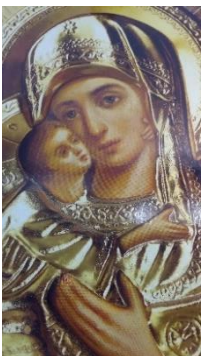

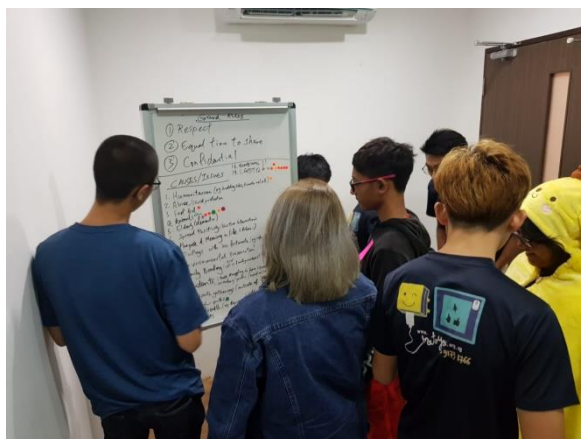
## MeToYou Youth Outreach Programme (YO!!!)

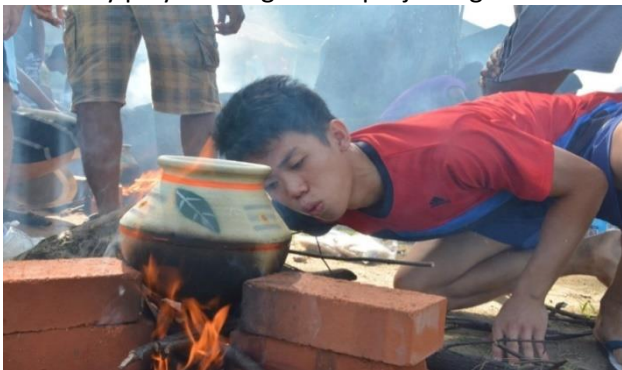

The term of office of the current office bearers would be ending soon and they would be having their annual general meeting on the 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2019 to elect the new office bearers.

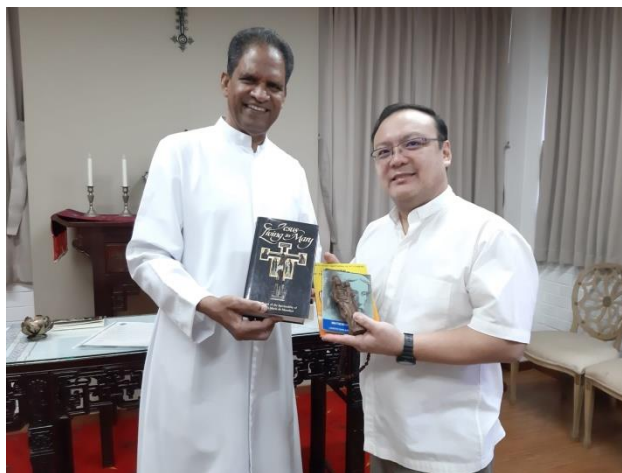

## Malaysian Institutions' Inter-Board Meeting

**Singapore:** The Malaysian Institutions' Inter-Board meeting met on the 28<sup>th</sup> to 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2019. The main agenda for the meeting was to discuss about the Technical and Vocational Education Trainings (TVET) Programme in the Malaysian Institutions. In the key note address of Bro. Arul Rayan (SG), from the Philippines, said that the TVET is rapidly changing in the technical training landscape in Asia. Bro. Arul

Rayan, who hails from India had been a missionary in the Philippines for many years and his doctoral thesis was based on TVET. His research covered a wide geographical area including Malaysia and Singapore.

The meeting also discussed on Monfortian Pedagogy – *Inclusive Education for 21<sup>st</sup> Century*. This paper was presented by Bro. Dominic Yeo-Koh (SG), the Montfortian-Gabrielite School Supervisor in Singapore. Bro John Albert (SG), the then Provincial Superior, presented the topic on *Collaborative Leadership for management of Montfort TVET, Malaysia*.

The Malaysian Institutions are running Technical and Vocational Trainings for the youth. The funding of the institutions are mainly from public donations and fund-raising. Financial trends of the institutions were also presented to know the operational costs sustainability.

The meeting was well represented where all the three Malaysian Institutions sent their delegations including directors, deputy directors and senior staff. In total there were 21 participants and facilitators attended the meeting. They were 9 Board Members, 6 Brothers, 5 senior staff members and Bro. Arul Rayan.

At the end of the 3 days' meeting, the delegations charted *Direction for Management, Sustainability, Relevant Skills – The Way Forward* for the institutions in Malaysia.

This inter-board meeting was held for the second time. The first meeting was held some six or seven years ago. It was a fruitful meeting for the Board members and also to have greater interactions between them.
