Assessment and Promotion Criteria

Every student is encouraged to take responsibility for his own learning. The school's assessment modes and weightage will enable students to develop independent and consistent learning throughout the year.

Assessment Modes and Weightage

- Assessment of the overall performance of a student is based on the whole year's assessments administered by the school.
- The computation of Continual Assessment marks for each semester (WA1 and WA2) is the cumulative marks of various modes of assessments for the semester. These may include class tests, assignments, project work etc.
- The weighting of every assessment component (WA1, WA2, MYE and EYE) contributes to the overall percentage of 100% for the year.

Lateral Transfer Criteria

- Sec 1, 2 and 3 students who show exceptional ability and academic performance may apply to be laterally transferred to a more demanding course / stream when they meet the following criteria:
 - a. 70% or higher in the average for all subjects based on year end overall results
 - b. deemed able to cope with the more demanding course / stream.
