MOE Edusave Awards:

Edusave Awards are given by the government annually to Singaporean students to help enhance educational opportunities and motivate students to excel in schools in academic and non-academic domains. These Singaporean students must have performed well or made good progress in their school work and have good conduct.

To emphasize the importance that MOE places on nurturing students with good values and character, MOE has introduced starting from 2012, an Edusave Character Award (ECHA) which recognises students who demonstrate exemplary values and personal qualities through their behaviour and actions. The Award supports the school's continuing efforts in nurturing students of good values and civic responsibility, and who are also active contributors and concerned citizens.

Goh Chok Tong NextGen Outstanding Student Leader Award

Each year, the school will nominate up to three students who meet the criteria for the Award, which consists of an acrylic trophy as a memento and a cash cheque of \$500 for each student.

Junior and Senior STAR Gabrielite Award

This prestigious Award is presented by the school to recognize and promote students who exemplify the school's Vision: Servant Leader, Lifelong Learner and Gracious Citizen, and who have succeeded in the following areas:
